

School Garden Summer School 8th September 2022 Győr, Hungary

Dear Colleague,

We are inviting you to our international training in school gardening, especially offered to school garden leaders from schools, kindergartens, other facilities providing gardening activities for children (e.g. botanical gardens). ONLINE PART: available from **25th August to 31 December** 2022 on Moodle platform. The participant must read materials and watch videos, needs appr. 16 hours.

ON SITE PART: Széchenyi University, H-9022 **Győr, Liszt F. u. 42. Hungary, Thursday, 8th September 2022**. Arrival: 8:00-9:00 CET. Program start: 9:00 (8th Sept.). End of Program: 18:00 (8th Sept.) This part of the course is organized in parallel groups, in the university school garden. Participants of the online and on-site parts of the training will receive an Erasmus Mobility Pass CERTIFICATE.

OPTONAL PROGRAM: Friday, 9th September, 8:00-15:00 School garden excursion in Győr. Four other local



school gardens (nursery school, kindergarten, primary school, special needs school) are visited.

The hosting university serves dining, supports accommodation, but the travel is organized and paid by the participant, or sending institution. Győr is <u>easily accessible</u> by bus or train as well (appr. 1:30 from Vienna or Budapest), the site is close to the stations, and organizers can transport participants from the stations, if needed.



Both the university and its practice primary school owns a school garden in its yard, walking distance from the training, providing an opportunity of watching real school garden activities and instruction with children. The onsite part requires personal meeting and inspiring, handy practice, supported by online materials. The trainers are experts from Austria, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Serbia, and Spain.



PROGRAM of the on-site part:

9:00 introducing the group, training info

10:00-13:00 parallel workshops, each participant is taking part in all of the workshops (Dorothee Benkowitz: Biodiversity in the school garden, Stefan Jarau: Soil fauna investigations, Renáta Barabás: Handcrafting with garden plants)

13:00-14:30: lunch and school garden guiding

14:30-18:00: parallel workshops with coffee break, each participant is taking part in all of the workshops (Svenja Baumgartinger: From the garden of the plate – you can eat more than you think -

start food rescue at harvest, Ilona Szeles-Kása: The colored garden: dye plants activities, Anja Burtscher: Box garden design for schools with small ground)

Evening: dinner and sightseeing in the historical town centre of Győr

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
